**Wounded Words: Building a Vocabulary of Faith**

**Taught by Barbara W. ten Hove: August 1, 2011 – August 28, 2011**

Together we will explore what important religious words such as God, Prayer, Worship and Religion might mean for us personally and as Unitarian Universalists. We will read sermons by the instructor and others on the topics and address reasons to use (or not use) religious language in our interactions with others and in our progressive congregations. \$40

**Theology for Unitarian Universalists**

**Taught by Myriam Renaud: September 14, 2011 – October 19, 2011**

Interested in learning more about some of the major theological strands in Unitarian Universalism? Looking for some fresh and refreshing ideas that you could incorporate into your personal theology? This five-session course will cover early Christianity, the atheism-agnosticism-deism-theism continuum, religious and secular humanism, earth-based religions, and process and religious-naturalist thought—all from a UU perspective. \$40

**Economic Justice and the Bible**

**Taught by Darcey Laine and Amy Zucker Morgenstern: September 14, 2011 – October 25, 2011**

The authors of the Bible expressed many strong opinions about economics, from advocating the complete erasure of debts every 50 years to suggesting that the way to get to heaven is to give away everything we own. In this class we'll learn about some of the Biblical attitudes about economic issues, compare them to our own and other modern convictions, and challenge ourselves to think deeply about what would constitute a just economic system. \$40

**Doorways into Prayer**

**Taught by Amanda Aikman : November 14, 2011 – December 11, 2011**

There are so many jokes about UU's praying "To Whom It May Concern" and the like, that we might not realize that prayer is something that many UUs do on a regular basis. Some of us who are new to prayer may need a few ideas to get started, and those of us who have been people of prayer for some time may feel a little stale and need some new ideas. In this four-session class, we will form a supportive prayer circle and explore several prayer practices together and on our own. Whether you are an agnostic, a mystic, or "none of the above," this class will offer you a guided, accompanied journey through several doorways into prayer. \$40

**In Our Mothers' Footsteps**

**Ongoing**

This course shares information about important women from our Unitarian and/or Universalist heritage, but more than that, it offers the opportunity for modern women and men to reflect on how our own lives connect with those of our foremothers, and what we might have to learn from their struggles and successes. The course is divided into five sessions: Suffragists, Abolitionists, Writers, Educators and Ministers.
