One Useful Tool

UU Musician's Network Composer's Database

Many people seem to think that the closest thing we Unitarian Universalists have to our own religious music are the songs in Singing The Living Tradition for which new words have been set to old tunes. There are others who know the work of, perhaps, Jason Shelton, Shelly Jackson Denham, or Mary Grigolia. But if you had to guess how many composers are working today creating new music *from* a Unitarian Universalist perspective *for* a Unitarian Universalist audience, how many would you guess? A dozen? Two dozen?

In collaboration with the Unitarian Universalist Musicians' Network, the UUA's Office of Worship and Music Resources has complied a list of *nearly ninety* Unitarian Universalist composers who are working today to advance our principles through their art. And the list keeps growing.

Choral music, children's songs, music for contemporary worship bands – if it's a musical style, somebody is working in it. The database contains basic information about each composer's style, as well as contact information. [Click](#) and scroll through this amazing resource.
