Training of OWL Trainers Scheduled for May 2013

Applications are now being accepted for an OWL Training of Trainers to be held in Boston from May 16-19, 2013. The training will prepare new trainers to train OWL facilitators for grades 7-12. This training will include the significant new OWL material in the 2013 edition of OWL Grades 7-9, such as social media, bullying, and new perspectives on gender identity and sexual violence.
