One Thing Going On

Deadline for UUA Scholarship Applications: April 15, 2013

As we move toward the end of the year, the Ministerial Credentialing Office will be preparing the 2013-14 UUA Scholarship applications materials which will be available on www.uua.org beginning the first week of January 2013. All materials will be due into the Ministerial Credentialing Office by 5pm on Monday, April 15th, 2013. There can be no exceptions and late materials will render an application incomplete and will not be reviewed by the UUA Scholarship Committee.

Following the recommendations as outlined in the [Strategic Plan for Professional Ministries](#), the 2013-14 financial aid cycle will be the second year that the UUA Scholarship Committee has been seeking to reward the most meritorious applicants by granting fewer, but significantly larger scholarships. Last year, the UUA Scholarship Committee awarded a total of \$170,000 in scholarships that included thirteen \$10,000 scholarships and six part-time scholarships totaling \$40,000.
