Got Conflict?

In the FACT 2000 national survey of 14,301 American congregations, 75 percent of congregations reported some level of conflict in the five years prior to the survey. At any given time it appears that about one fifth of congregations have active conflict. Since "everybody is doing it," understanding how conflict impacts congregations strikes us as an absolute necessity. Knowing how to avoid or soften its destructive aspects and reap the benefits that can come from handling it are basic skills for leaders today.
