Last week was an exciting time for Unitarian Universalists, as delegates from across the country met in Providence, RI for our 2014 General Assembly (GA). At this year's GA 5,000 UUs worshipped together, discussed and voted on the important business of our Association, and reached out in love. Delegates passed a resolution calling for divestment from fossil fuel companies, heard a moving Ware Lecture by Sister Simone Campbell, and celebrated reaching out in love with a WaterFire Public Witness Event.

At the close of GA on Sunday, UUA President the Rev. Peter Morales and UU Moderator Jim Key issued a statement that read in part, "We are grateful for the continuing faith and generosity of you – our congregations, family, and friends. Your gifts of time and treasure show us exactly how Unitarian Universalism can make a real difference in our lives, our communities, and our world. Thank you."
