

Mission of the Unitarian Universalist Association President's Council

Established in 1992 with the concurrence and support of the Unitarian Universalist Association's Board of Trustees, the UUA President's Council is charged with a) providing the President of the UUA with suggestions and feedback on stewardship of the Association and the Movement, and on related matters; b) providing counsel and leadership for Association resource development efforts; and c) helping to increase knowledge and support of the UUA and its programs through advocacy with individuals and congregations.

The President and staff will provide Council members with the information and resources required to meet this charge and the Council shall organize itself in such a way as to facilitate its fulfillment. The Council as a whole will expect to meet at least once a year.

Members of the Council shall serve three-year terms at the invitation and pleasure of the UUA President. The Council is an appropriate, serious, and necessary complement to the fiduciary role of the Board of Trustees and thus neither competitive with Board activity nor irrelevant to it. There should be provision for periodic, informal contact between the Council and the Board.

The work of the Council shall continue to be informed by the "Framework for Activating" passed April 23, 1992 as revised October 4, 1997 upon which the Council was founded.
