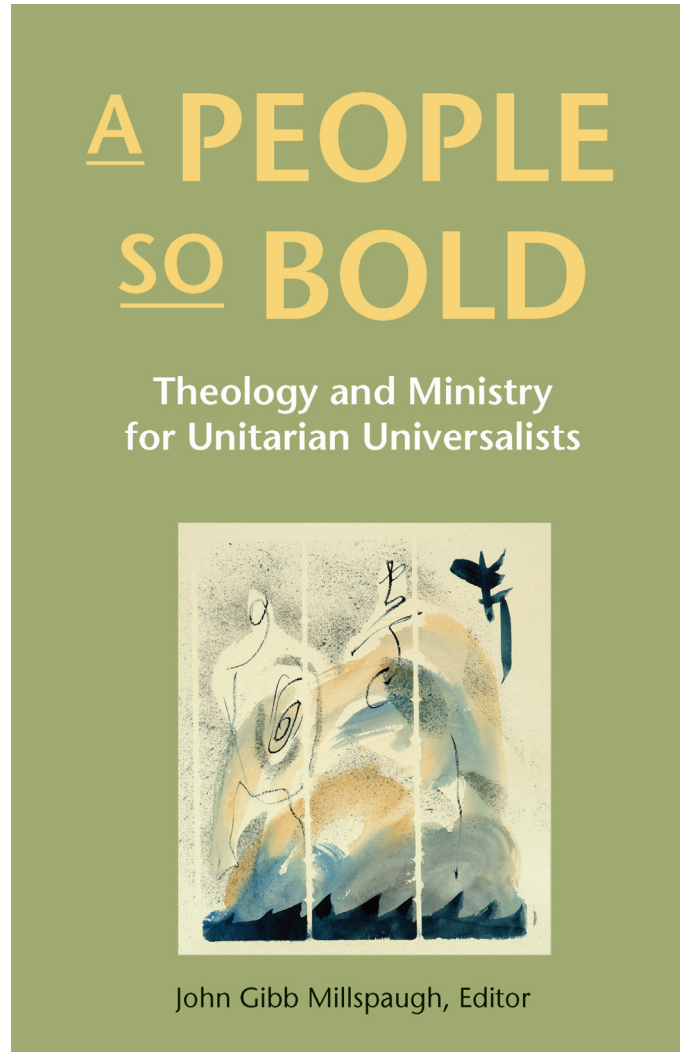


New from Skinner House Books
