**Berkeley Fellowship of UUs     - Berkeley, CA     \$7,000**  
***Oral History and Book Project***     For an oral history project that will use intergenerational story circles and interviews with elders to document the stories of the fellowship and build relationships between young adults and elders. The Project will generate a book, an archive of audio interviews and a curriculum and DVD for other UU congregations on this process.

**First Unitarian Church of Pittsburgh - Pittsburgh, PA     \$5,000**  
***To Preserve the Past - Archiving UU Church Records***     A second grant to complete the work of creating a central archival collection of UU churches in western Pennsylvania.

**First Unitarian Church of Victoria     - Victoria, B.C.     Canada**  
**\$4,675**  
***Missa Brevis Pro Serveto***     For a choral arrangement of a Latin mass expressing UU values which can be sung by UU church choirs and will be made available free of royalties for use in worship and social justice settings.

**Margaret Fuller Bicentennial Committee - UUA - Concord, MA     \$18,000**  
For a celebration of the 200th anniversary of Margaret Fuller's birth in 2010 which will produce resources, among them a book, copies of lectures, and an anthem, that will keep her legacy alive.

**Mass Bay District of the U.U.A. - Watertown MA     \$14,635**  
***Multimedia Learning Congregations***     To continue to provide high quality training programs the equips leaders to be transformative agents in their congregations with development of easy-to-access web-based training materials in a variety of multimedia formats.

**Northern New England District UUA - Concord, NH**  
**\$9,000, \$2,000 Challenge**  
***National Resources for Small Congregations***     To develop resources for small congregations of fewer than 100 throughout the UU movement.

**Pacific Southwest District UUA - Oxnard, CA \$13,350**  
***Ministering with Technology*** To improve and strengthen the ministries of district - and association - congregations through a variety of technologies, software and media.

**Southwest U.U. Women - Houston, TX \$11,600**  
**Phase II: Global Online Community and Database of Model Programs and Partnerships** To foster cross-cultural, national and international relationships developed amongst women attendees at the International Convocation, action recommendaions of the ICUUW and key infrastructure for promoting principles from model partnerships and initiatives if th ICUUW.

**U.U. Fellowship of Dubuque - Healing Moments Alzheimers Ministry - Dubuque, IA \$11,000**  
***Healing Power of Yes!/ Meeting in the Moment*** To pilot two programs in a Massachusetts UU congregation designed to support UUs providing care or pastoral support for people with Alzheimers.

**U.U. Historical Society - Scituate, MA \$5,000**  
***Toward a More Integrated Past: Editor's Role UUHS Journal*** To reinvent the historical society and provide compensation for the editor.

**U.U. Musicians Network - Charlotte, NC \$6,000, \$2,000 Challenge**  
**Spanish-language Hymnbook Las Voces del Camino** To publish a Spanish language songbook with 75 songs with additional worship resources in Spanish and English.

**U.U. Society for Community Ministries - Salem, OR \$10,000, \$10,000 Challenge**  
***Framing the Future of Community Ministry*** To develop a sustainable future for Community Ministry and support the 2009 campaign to build a diverse funding base and leverage pledged gifts of major donors and launch a public information effort to awaken UU congregations to this ministry.

**Unitarian Universalists at Riderwood - Silver Spring, MD \$4,000**  
***UU Chaplain*** To support a chaplaincy for an association of residents of a retirement community.

**UUs of the South Bay - San Diego, CA \$15,000**  
***UUs of the South Bay*** To create a self-sustaining UU congregation in a fast growing multi-cultural area of San Diego, using existing staff and infrastructure of a host congregation, the First UU Church of San Diego, to leverage resources and model a new approach to extend Unitarian Universalism.
