### **The Basics**

One congregation from **Pacific Central District** returned report forms.

- Welcoming congregation
- Mid-Size
- No youth position on the Board of Trustees

### **Intergenerational Community Relations**

- "Sense of community"
- "Social value – community and friendship, fun"
- Decided to have more "mixed age activities"

### **Mission, Vision and Priorities**

- Does not have a **Youth Adult Committee**
- "Continuing vision of RE program"
- "Lack of vision"
- Decided to find "other churches with successful programs" in order to learn about "ideas for UU activities that stress UU values"



## **Pacific Central District Congregational Conversation Results**

### **Curriculum, Resources and Transitional Age Youth**

- “Commitment of time” and “consistent scheduling”
- “Adult apathy” and “lack of parent commitment”
- Decided to build “good program: not just curriculum but activities” and use UUA as a resource
- One result of their congregation was the decision to have “joint meetings with other groups I.e. other faiths of social justice groups”

### **Serving the Spiritual Needs of Youth**

- “Youth perception: church is not fun”
- “Youth greeters, youth in pulpit - youth already lead other parts of service”
- “Carpooling and phone tree to facilitate attendance (parent steering committee)”
