Multiracial Families

Yet these families have particular needs which are often not addressed by the mainstream culture of our congregations. Under the leadership of the **Rev. Leslie Takahashi-Morris** co-minister, Mt. Diablo Unitarian Universalist Church, we are currently compiling a resource guide for districts and congregations to help provide special ministries to these families that will help them bring their whole selves to Unitarian Universalism.

Updates from Constituent Organizations:

DRUUMM

Under the leadership of President Rev. Danielle DiBona and an active steering committee, the Diverse and Revolutionary Unitarian Universalist Multicultural Ministries is actively working on expanding opportunities for DRUUMM members to meet and be together at the regional level. A Philadelphia-area meeting took place in December, and meetings are planned on the east and west coasts for the spring of 2010. Other priorities include building a more effective membership system and working on programming and gathering for people of color at this year's General Assembly.

UUMA

We are in active dialogue with the **Unitarian Universalist Ministers Association (UUMA)** and will meet with them in April. The UUMA is committed to serving our ministers of color. On their executive committee, **Rev. Hope Johnson** holds the portfolio for anti-racism, anti-oppression, and multiculturalism.

LREDA

The UU Religious Educators of Color Network is being created. Our plan is to bond, articulate our mission, and foster professionalism plus self-care. In the near future we hope to work collaboratively with LREDA, particularly with the LREDA Integrity Team.
