## **QUESTIONS:**

How do recommendations move JTWTC beyond assessment and monitoring?

Is there a model that can provide consistency in analyzing and reporting the district information?

Based on the date being gathered re: what congregations and districts are doing, what are the implications around expectations of congregations in A-R/A-O/M-C work remembering that congregations are volunteer structures.

How does the identity of the respondent (race, ethnicity, age, ability, etc.) influence responses?

Does it make a difference that congregants have more born UUs/long-time UUs re: A-R/A-O/M-C work?

What did interviewers promise the district respondents?

<u>ACTION</u>: Address the questions at left in analysis and report.

PARKING LOT: Examine role of district executives and job descriptions, particularly differences in perception about leadership role versus service/resource provider.

ACTION: Lift up in the report the assumption that the people who carry a particular identity have to be present for congregations and districts to do A-R/A-O/M-C work. For example, you have to wait until there are people of color to do anti-racism work; there have to be people with disabilities in order to do accessibility/anti-ableism work.

ACTION: Specify the limitations of the study and sources in the report. Interview specific constituents re: their knowledge of work in the districts. Include data that is available from the UUA on activity in the district. Describe design of study.

<u>DECISION</u>: JTWTC focus for the future will be ministerial development and settlement.

Areas include ministerial

		development and settlement: (1) RSCC and MFC, (2) mentorship for ministers of color and/or Latina/o/Hispanic ministers; (3) preparing congregations for calling and settling ministers (BCT – effectiveness); (4) UUMA relationship; (5) identity-based ministerial groups; (6) perspectives of affiliate organizations on ministerial development and settlement.
Report to the Board of Trustees (Carolyn Cartland) DUE DATE: December 19, 2006	JTWTC reviewed the January 2006 report to the BOT in preparation for the 2007 report. The Cmte agreed to identify the next focus (monitoring and assessment) area prior to meeting with BOT. They also agreed to list monitoring and assessment activities to date, including "Finding Common Ground" meetings, UUA staff report, and district assessment. They were asked to consider ministerial settlement as the next priority area, following the lead of President Sinkford.
