




















## FINAL REPORT OF THE TASK FORCE ON HOMOSEXUALITY

October 10, 1969

In September 1967, a York Force on Homosemuality was appointed by Dr. Starley F. Foller, Director of the National Institute of Montal Health .- This proup consisted of outstanding behaviors, medical, social and legal scientists. Fifteen members were appointed to serve on the Task Force. One member, Judge David Baselon, found it necessary because of the pressure of other committments to resign prior to the completion of the group's deliberations. Each member has had extensive research and study experience in the areas of semulity and sexual deviation. The mandate of the Task Force was to review carefully the morront state of knowledge regarding homosexuality in its mental health repeats and to make recommendations for Institute programming in this area.
