Staff Transition

As of July 1, **Alicia Forde**, our former Multicultural Congregations Coordinator, became the **Professional Development Director** in Ministries & Faith Development! We wish Alicia the very best and look forward to collaborating with her in her new role.

Over the past several months, the Multicultural Growth Team of the Multicultural Growth & Witness staff group has been engaged in an analysis of the team's composition with the aim of more effectively fulfilling its mission. The team identified two critical goals: clarifying the intersections between Unitarian Universalist LGBT Ministries and Unitarian Universalist Racial and Ethnic Ministries; and forging stronger links between congregational transformation and social justice transformation in the wider world. As a result of this analysis, the team implemented the following changes on July 1, 2012:

1. The Multicultural Growth Team of MG&W became the **Multicultural Ministries Team**.
2. The Multicultural Growth Director became the **Multicultural Ministries and Leadership Director**. The Multicultural Ministries and Leadership Director will guide the strategic planning and implementation of the **Multicultural Leadership Institute**, a leadership development initiative designed to inspire, equip, and nurture professional and lay religious leaders who are committed to creating intentionally diverse, welcoming, inclusive, justice-centered multicultural and multigenerational ministries.
3. A new position called **LGBTQ and Multicultural Ministries Program Manager** has been created. This position brings together aspects of the LGBTQ Ministries portfolio and the Multicultural Congregations portfolio. 4. The word "**queer**" will be added to the language MG&W uses to describe marginalized sexual orientations and gender identities/gender expressions. "Lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT)" will become "lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer (LGBTQ)." The LGBT Ministries portfolio will become the LGBTQ Ministries portfolio.

Multicultural Ministries Team

Our team's transition from the Multicultural Growth Team to the Multicultural Ministries Team reflects our commitment to support UU congregations and communities in growing their capacity to welcome, include, minister to, and act in solidarity with people of various identities as individuals and communities in a multicultural world.
