### One Thing Going On

#### Civil Rights Veterans Gathering

March 30 to April 1, 2012 will be an historic time in Asheville, North Carolina. For the first time ever, current and former Unitarian Universalists who were active in the civil rights movement of the 1950s and 1960s will come together to share stories, meet each other, see old friends, and most importantly preserve an important part of our Unitarian Universalist heritage.

Throughout the weekend, we will be video recording panel presentations and individual oral histories to capture these stories of courage, conviction, and commitment so future generations can come to understand what it was like to stand on the side of love when the stakes were so very high.

If you are one of the people who served or if you know someone who was, we'd like to know. It may be a quiet person appearing from time to time in a back row, or maybe it is someone who has never given up on raising hell with injustice, or perhaps it is a member or friend who has drifted away from Unitarian Universalism because we don't meet their standards of justice-seeking.

We are especially hopeful to include people of color, whose relationship to a congregation may have been informal or unofficial, and lay people, whose roles may have been less recognized than those of ministers.

#### Christian Century

When is the last time you took a look at the **Christian Century**?

For \$39 a year (\$4.95 for a two week trial) you can have unlimited online access to this stunning resource for those interested in progressive religion for our time. Their mission statement could represent many of our UU congregations: "Thinking Critically. Living Faithfully." Current highlighted articles include a look at Reinhold Niebuhr's silent writing partner – his spouse Ursula; an analysis of our US addiction to accumulating things; the diplomatic option with Iran, and a reflection on depression and faith. In addition there are more practical articles offering "Ten New Models for a New Generation," "New Harmonies" on music and identity, "Generational Roadblocks" and more.

Originally founded in 1884 as the *Christian Oracle*, the magazine took its current name at the turn of the 20th century. It has managed to update itself over time and remain both relevant and provocative – something we as UUs could learn from!
