General Stewardship Resources

There are a great many resources to help you in your work towards creating a more organic, embedded understanding of stewardship of your congregation or cause. Here are a few readings that we particularly recommend in the spirit of this worship workshop.

- **Not Your Parents' Offering Plate: A New Vision for Financial Stewardship by J. Clif Christopher**

Unlike leading nonprofit agencies and institutions, we too often fail to convince potential givers that their gifts will have impact and significance. In this book, Christopher lays out the main reasons for this failure to capture the imagination of potential givers, including our frequent failure simply to ask. Written with the needs of pastors and stewardship teams in mind. From a Christian perspective; some translation necessary.

- **Making the Annual Pledge Drive Obsolete: How Churches Can Get Out of This Business Once and For All by Michael Durall & Timothy Dombek**

This slim volume is thick with helpful material, and could be used by congregations where there is a desire for serious change in the usual stewardship efforts. Good stewardship material is not for the faint of heart, and this volume offers no easy bromides, convenient shortcuts, or gimmicks. Rather, the authors address giving in a positive community-building manner. The introduction reminds the reader that generosity can be “just plain fun” as well as being a deeply religious act. We need more of this kind of bravery in our tradition!

- ***The Soul of Money: Reclaiming the Wealth of Our Inner Resources* by Lynne Twist**

Global activist Lynne Twist, through personal stories and advice, re-imagines our attitudes about money. Twist takes us from feelings of scarcity and burden to feelings of freedom and abundance. Twist shows us that money can be an effective tool to create meaningful and positive change.

- **Asking: A 59-Minute Guide to Everything Board Members, Volunteers, and Staff Must Know to Secure the Gift by Jerold Panas**

In this quick, straightforward book readers are given tools and vignettes to take some of the anxiety out of asking for money, replacing it with excitement for our respective causes.
