UU United Nations Office

For years, the US has withheld UN dues, in violation of Charter obligations. US Congressional leadership has been consistently hostile to the UN. AIDS is the leading cause of death in Subsaharan Africa (25 million live with infection). Intense search for its origins indicate that these may be HIV infection and may be contaminated chimpanzee tissue in production of an experimental polio vaccine.
