


Accessibility Services

Persons with vision, hearing or mobility impairment or other special needs will find information about various kinds of assistance and accessibility at the Accessibility Table in the Houston Street Concourse of the Fort Worth Convention Center.

Alcohol

Any General Assembly event offering alcoholic beverages must also offer attractive non-alcoholic beverages with equal accessibility and prominence. No alcoholic beverages will be served to anyone under the age of 21.

Annual Program Fund

The UUA Stewardship and Development Staff Group's Annual Program Fund table is in the Houston Street Concourse of the Fort Worth Convention Center. Purple Honor Society Ribbons, Pink Merit Ribbons and Green Leadership Ribbons are distributed here. Detailed information about Planned Giving, the UUA Capital Campaign, Friends of the UUA and UU congregations' contributions to the APF is available.

Badges and Ribbons

GA registration and name badges are required for admission to GA events except the Service of the Living Tradition and the Sunday Morning Worship Service. Non-registrants may visit the Exhibit Hall. Delegates must wear delegate ribbons and have voting cards in order to vote at the Plenary Sessions.

Banners

Banner carriers for the Opening Celebration banner parade should report to the staging area in the Houston Street Arena Lobby of the Fort Worth Convention Center at 6:45 p.m. Thursday to line up for the parade. Banner poles will be on sale in the staging area. Make other arrangements for the security of your purses or other valuables and don't bring them to the staging area. Because of increasing space and logistical difficulties as the number of banners grows every year, only the banners of congregations and districts will be hung after the Opening Ceremony to contribute to the ambiance of GA. Related organizations are invited to display their banners in their exhibit hall booth or at their group's meetings. All banners to be hung in the banner display areas must be registered before the parade so they can be part of our banner protection system, and all must have the required sleeve at the top. The registration form will ask for the name of the person who is authorized to pick up your church banner. I.D. will be required for pickup. Hung banners may not be picked up or removed

until Monday from 11:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. in Room 113 of the Fort Worth Convention Center. If your church cannot arrange for pick-up at the designated time please do not leave your banner for hanging.

Board of Trustees, UUA

The UUA is governed by a Board of Trustees consisting of District Trustees, selected by the various Districts; and four Trustees-at-Large (includes a youth trustee) elected by delegates to General Assembly. The UUA Moderator, elected by delegates to GA, presides at the General Assembly and at meetings of the Board of Trustees and represents the Association on special occasions. General Information

Chaplains

A chaplain is available at any hour during GA for assistance in case of personal emergency or need for pastoral care. Office hours for chaplains will be 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. Thursday through Monday in Room 122 of the Fort Worth Convention Center. The telephone number for reaching chaplains at all other times will be printed in the daily newsletter.

Chemical and Electrical Sensitivities

The GA Planning Committee is committed to making GA accessible to the greatest extent possible to individuals with Chemical and Electrical Sensitivities. There will be a fragrance free section of the Plenary Hall. You may bring your questions and concerns to the Accessibility table in the Houston Street Concourse of the Fort Worth Convention Center.

Children's Programs

Children ages 6 months through 5 years participating in the GA Child Care program meet daily in the Radisson Hotel. The Day Camp for children ages 6 - 10 gathers in the Radisson Hotel in the morning and spends some time exploring Fort Worth. Pre-registration is required for these daytime children's programs. Referrals for evening babysitting may be available from your hotel.

Collections

The Planning Committee intends for the registration fee to cover all GA programming events. In the occasional instance in which a collection may be taken during an event (such as the Service of the Living Tradition) or the purchase of a ticket is required (such as the Intergenerational Lunch), this must be announced in advance in the Program or on the registration form. Exhibit Booths in the Exhibit Hall and those events which are classified as "private" and do not appear in the Program are exempt. This year collections will be taken at the Service of Living Tradition and the Sunday Morning Worship.

Commission on Social Witness, UUA

The Commission on Social Witness's mission is to help UUs put our Principles and Purposes into action. The CSW assists the UUA and its member congregations by facilitating the articulation of suggested Study/Action Issues (SAIs) and educating UUs in potential social change inherent in SAIs. After two years of studying the SAIs, the CSW prepares and presents to the General Assembly draft Statements of Conscience. The CSW also facilitates the process of GA Actions of Immediate Witness.

Covenant Groups

"Small Group Ministry" refers to groups of up to 10 who meet regularly with a facilitator, develop their own covenant of behavior to deepen friendships, and share stories and insights from their life journeys. This year's Covenant Group program offers a taste of Small Group Ministry while providing islands of community to those who might otherwise feel lost in the glorious, confusing rush and complexity of GA. Participants signed up prior to GA for this program; unfortunately, logistics will not accommodate on-site registration.

Cyber Café and People Finder

Check your e-mail in the Cyber Café, Booth #130 in the Exhibit Hall. Please limit your stay to 15 minutes. The Cyber Cafe is made possible by the generous sponsorship of Church Mutual Insurance. You will also find the People Finder, a database in the Cyber Café that helps you to locate your friends at GA. You may also fill out the online GA evaluation form.

Delegates

After you have picked up your GA name badge, bring your credential card signed by your minister or church officer to the Delegate Credentialing Station in the Houston Street Concourse of the Convention Center to receive your delegate voting card and ribbon. Hold on to your ballot stub so that you may vote in Sunday's election (Suggestion: keep it in your Badge holder behind the name insert). You must have your delegate ribbon and voting card to vote in Plenary. If you lose your credential card, ribbon, voting card, or ballot stub, report to the Delegate Credentialing Station to fill out a replacement affidavit. Alternate delegates must bring their signed alternate delegate card along with either the original delegate card or the name badge of the original delegate.

Elections

The Candidates' Forum will be during Saturday night's Plenary in the Arena of the Fort Worth Convention Center. Delegates may cast their vote in the 11th Street Exhibit Hall (front right corner) on Sunday from noon until 6:00 p.m. Voters should have their delegate ribbon, and the stub from their credential card when arriving at the polling area.

Emergencies

All hotels and the Convention Center have personnel who can assist with medical emergencies. In the Fort Worth Convention Center, the Emergency Medical Personnel will be located in the First Aid Office in the Arena Section of the Convention Center next to Room 107. For additional information or in case of non-emergency medical needs, go to the Local Information table in the Houston Street Concourse of the Convention Center. The UUA carries an insurance policy to cover accidents. Please inform the GA Office of any medical emergencies or accidents.

Etiquette at General Assembly

Let us remember our UU commitment to the worth and dignity of all people. The UUA affirms its commitment to maintain an environment free of discrimination and harassment based on race, color, national origin, religion, age, sex, sexual orientation, or disability. The Association expects all attendees to conduct themselves in a professional manner with concern and respect for all. As a courtesy, please allow persons using wheelchairs and scooters to exit meeting rooms first. Also, please leave elevators free for the use of persons using wheelchairs and scooters.

Evaluation

The Planning Committee encourages your comments on individual programs at GA and the overall quality of GA. Events Open to the Public

The Service of the Living Tradition, the Sunday Morning Worship, and the Exhibit Hall are the only events open to people who are not registered for GA. Non-registrants must pick up a pass for the Exhibit Hall at the General Assembly and Volunteer Office, Room 105 of the Fort Worth Convention Center, before entering the Hall. Registration and a GA badge are required for attendance at all other events.

Literature Distribution

Materials promoting GA events, position papers on business items, and any other leaflets may be handed out by individuals, but may not be left on tables in lobbies. Materials may not be distributed near the entrance to the Plenary Hall or in a manner that impedes traffic. In the Exhibit Hall, all materials must be distributed within exhibit booths. No materials may be distributed inside the Plenary Hall except official business papers authorized by the Planning Committee.

Local Information

The GA Local Information table in the Houston Street Concourse of the Convention Center is staffed by UU volunteers and the Fort Worth Convention and Visitors Bureau, who provide information and answer questions about the area. Parking





Patrick was a charter member of the UUMA CENTER Committee and the UUMA Continuing Education Commission. He was awarded the UUSC Vision of Justice Sermon Award in 1999 and the 2001 UUA Annual Stewardship Sermon Award. The Wilmington congregation was honored with the O. Eugene Pickett Award in 1999.

Elaine Pagels is a preeminent figure in the theological community whose impressive scholarship has earned her international respect. She presents even the most esoteric material in a fashion accessible to those who know nothing of her subject. Pagels will speak about controversy over the characterization of Jesus as presented in the New Testament Gospel of John and the Gospel of

Thomas, a first century gospel discovered in Egypt in 1945—a controversy with enormous implications for our understanding of Christian tradition even today.

Pagels is the Harrington Spear Paine Professor of Religion at Princeton University and has been awarded several prestigious fellowships including a Rockefeller Fellowship (1978), a Guggenheim Fellowship (1979), and the MacArthur Prize (1981). Pagels has taught at Princeton University since 1983.

As a young researcher at Barnard College, she changed forever the historical landscape of the Christian religion by exploding the myth of the early Christian Church as a unified movement.

Her findings were published in 1979 in the bestselling book, The Gnostic Gospels, an analysis of 52 early Christian manuscripts that were unearthed in Egypt. Known collectively as the Nag Hammadi Library, the manuscripts show the pluralistic nature of the early church and the role of women in the developing Christian movement. The Gnostic Gospels won both the National Book Critic's Circle Award and the National Book Award and was chosen by the Modern Library as one of the 100 best books of the 20th Century.

Pagels' 1995 book, The Origin of Satan, chronicles the evolution of Jewish and Christian concepts of evil. Her New York Times bestseller, Beyond Belief: The Secret Gospel of Thomas (May 2003), focuses on religious claims to possessing the ultimate "truth." She contends that, as Christianity became increasingly institutionalized, it became more politicized and less pluralistic. Says Pagels, "I'm advocating, on some level, the inclusion of [religious texts] that were considered blasphemous. I suggest that there are ways of embracing a far wider spectrum of religious diversity within Christianity and quite beyond Christianity."

Pagels earned an M.A. from Stanford University and Ph.D. "With Distinction" from Harvard.

HISTORY OF THE WARE LECTURE

In 1920, Harriet E. Ware of Milton, Massachusetts bequeathed \$5,000 to the American Unitarian Association for its unrestricted use. Two years later, on the evening of May 24, 1922, the first Ware lecture was given by the Rev. Frederick W. Norwood, pastor of the City Temple in London, England. The Lecture had been "established in honor of the distinguished services of three generations of the Ware family to the cause of Pure Christianity."

The lecture has been given every year at the former May Meetings of the AUA and since 1961 at the General Assembly. No lecture was scheduled for 1945 due to World War II, although Morris S. Lazaron delivered an address on May 23, 1945, in All Souls Church in Washington, D.C., which is referred to as a Ware lecture. There was no lecture in 1950 when the Unitarians celebrated their 125th anniversary.






