Accessibility Services

Any other General Assembly event offering alcoholic beverages must also offer attractive non-alcoholic beverages with equal accessibility and prominence. No alcoholic beverages will be served to anyone under the age of 21.

Anti-Racism, Anti-Oppression, Multiculturalism and General Assembly

In 1994 and 1997 the General Assembly passed resolutions calling on the UUA to become an anti-racist, multicultural faith community, calling us on a Journey Toward Wholeness. Guided by our principles and in the spirit of these resolutions, all attendees are asked to be mindful of the ways racism and oppression impact our community and the larger community that is hosting our gathering. There are numerous opportunities through workshops and other programs to expand your awareness and deepen your understanding as together we strive to be a welcoming and inclusive community for all.

Banners

Banner carriers for the Opening Celebration banner parade should report to the staging area in the Second Floor Atrium of the America's Center at 7:00 p.m. Wednesday to line up for the parade. Banner poles will be on sale in the staging area. Make other arrangements for the security of your purses or other valuables and don't bring them to the staging area. Because of increasing space and logistical difficulties as the number of banners grows every year, only the banners of congregations and districts will be hung after the Opening Ceremony to contribute to the ambiance of GA. Related organizations are invited to display their banners in their exhibit hall booth or at their

group's meetings. All banners to be hung in the banner display areas must be registered before the parade so they can be part of our banner protection system, and all must have the required sleeve at the top. The registration form will ask for the name of the person who is authorized to pick up your church banner. I.D. will be required for pickup. Hung banners may not be picked up or removed until Sunday from 11:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. in Room E of the America's Center. If your church cannot arrange for pickup at the designated time please do not leave your banner for hanging.

Chaplains

A chaplain is available at any hour during GA for assistance in case of personal emergency or need for pastoral care. Office hours for chaplains will be 1:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. Wednesday and 12:00 p.m. to 2 p.m. Thursday through Sunday in Room 111 of the America's Center. The telephone number for reaching chaplains at all other times will be printed in the daily newsletter.

Chemical and Electrical Sensitivities

The GA Planning Committee is committed to making GA accessible to the greatest extent possible to individuals with Chemical and Electrical Sensitivities. There will be a fragrance free section of the Plenary Hall. You may bring your questions and concerns to the Accessibility table in the Washington Avenue Lobby of the America's Center.

Children's Programs

Children ages 6 months through 5 years participating in the GA Child Care program meet daily in the Holiday Inn Hotel. The Day Camp for children ages 6 - 10 gathers in the Holiday Inn Hotel in the morning and spends some time exploring St. Louis. Pre-registration is required for these daytime children's programs. Referrals for evening babysitting may be available from your hotel.

Collections

The Planning Committee intends for the registration fee to cover all GA programming events. In the occasional instance in which a collection may be taken during an event or the purchase of a ticket is required, this must be announced in advance in the Program or on the registration form. Exhibit Booths in the Exhibit Hall and those events which are classified as "private" and do not appear in the Program are exempt. This year collections will be taken at the Service of Living Tradition and the Sunday Morning Worship.

Commission on Social Witness, UUA

The Commission on Social Witness's mission is to help UUs put our Principles and Purposes into action. The CSW assists the UUA and its member congregations by facilitating the articulation of suggested Study/Action Issues (SAIs) and educating UUs in potential social change inherent in SAIs. After two years of studying the SAIs, the CSW prepares and presents to the General Assembly draft Statements of Conscience. The CSW also facilitates the process of GA Actions of Immediate Witness.

Covenant Groups

"Small Group Ministry" refers to groups of up to 10 who meet regularly with a facilitator, develop their own covenant of behavior to deepen friendships, and share stories and insights from their life journeys. This year's Covenant Group program offers a taste of Small Group Ministry while providing islands of community to those who might otherwise feel lost in the glorious, confusing rush and complexity of GA. Participants must have signed up prior to GA for this program; unfortunately, logistics will not accommodate on-site registration.

Cyber Cafe and People Finder

Check your e-mail in the Cyber Cafe, Booth #127 in the Exhibit Hall. Please limit your stay to 15 minutes. The Cyber Cafe is made possible by the generous sponsorship of Church Mutual Insurance. You will also find the People Finder, a database in the Cyber Cafe that helps you to locate your friends at GA. You may also fill out the online GA evaluation form.

Delegates

After you have picked up your GA name badge, bring your credential card signed by your minister or church officer to the Delegate Credentialing Station in the Washington Avenue Lobby of the America's Center to receive your delegate voting card and ribbon. You must have your delegate ribbon and voting card to vote in Plenary. If you lose your credential card, ribbon, or voting card, report to the Delegate Credentialing Station to fill out a replacement affidavit. Alternate delegates must bring their signed alternate delegate card along with either the original delegate card or the name badge of the original delegate.

Emergencies

All hotels and the America's Center have personnel who can assist with emergencies. In the America's Center, the Emergency Medical Personnel will be located in the First Aid Office in the Washington Avenue Lobby next to the entrance to the Exhibit Hall. Dialing 5016 on house phones will put you in touch with security personnel. The America's Center has requested that we contact their emergency or security personnel who will then contact 911, if necessary, in order to provide the most efficient response to an emergency. A roving police officer will be onsite at all times during General Assembly. For additional information or in case of non-emergency medical needs, go to the Local Information table in the Washington Avenue Lobby of the America's Center. The UUA carries an insurance policy to cover accidents. Please inform the GA Office of any medical emergencies or accidents.

Evaluation



Mary Oliver was born on September 10, 1935, in a small town in Ohio, a pastoral setting. From her earliest days the surrounding farms and fields and the deep woodlands attracted her, and she spent many hours there, walking, listening, even reading in a hundred congenial places. She graduated from the local high school, where she was a decent

enough student, she says, with what is probably a still-standing record for truancy. Later she studied at Ohio State University and Vassar College, but took no degree. For several years she lived at the home of Edna St. Vincent Millay, in upper New York state, companion, sometimes secretary, sometimes fellow gardener, with Norma Millay, and the poet's sister, and her husband, the painter Charles Ellis. In the late fifties she met Molly Malone Cook, and together they made a home in Provincetown, Massachusetts. They lived together, until Ms. Cook's death, for more than forty years.

Oliver's third book, *American Primitive*, won the Pulitzer Price for Poetry in 1984. During the next years she traveled widely, giving readings and holding residencies and workshops at various colleges and universities including Case Western Reserve, Bucknell, University of Cincinnati, and Sweet Briar College. Beginning in 1995, for five years, she held the Catharine Osgood Foster Chair for Distinguished Teaching at Bennington College. Her work appears in many magazines, among them *Poetry, The New Yorker, Spiritus, Orion, Shenandoah, Onearth, The Southern Review, Five Points*, and *Appalachia*. In April 2006, Beacon Press released *At Blackwater Pond*, a compact disc recording of Oliver reading a selection of forty of her poems.

Oliver's honors include fellowships from the National Endowment of the Arts (1972-1973) and the Guggenheim Foundation (1980-1981). She has also received an American Academy and Institute of Arts and Letters Achievement Award, a Lannan Literary Award, the 1991 Christopher and L.L. Winship/PEN New England Awards, and the Poetry Society of America's Shelley Memorial Prize.

HISTORY OF THE WARE LECTURE

In 1920, Harriet E. Ware of Milton, Massachusetts bequeathed \$5,000 to the American Unitarian Association for its unrestricted use. Two years later, on the evening of May 24, 1922, the first Ware lecture was given by the Rev. Frederick W. Norwood, pastor of the City Temple in London, England. The Lecture had been "established in honor of the distinguished services of three generations of the Ware family to the cause of Pure Christianity."

The lecture has been given every year at the former May Meetings of the AUA and since 1961 at the General Assembly. No lecture was scheduled for 1945 due to World War II, although Morris S. Lazaron delivered an address on May 23, 1945, in All Souls Church in Washington, D.C., which is referred to as a Ware lecture. There was no lecture in 1950 when the Unitarians celebrated their 125th anniversary.
