- letter describing the book, why you are qualified to write such a work, and why it is appropriate for the Skinner House audience
- a table of contents
- a draft introduction
- two draft chapters.

Skinner House Books does not consider unsolicited manuscripts. Due to the large number of submissions we receive, Skinner House is unable to comment in detail on manuscripts or proposals that are declined.
