UUs are Celebrating Marriage Equality with Free Weddings

Friday, June 26 was a day of joy and celebration as the U.S. Supreme Court established federal recognition of same-sex marriage with its 5-4 decision in *Obergefell v. Hodges*. This landmark decision was a cause for celebration for many of us, as Unitarian Universalists have been fighting for marriage equality for over three decades. UUA President Peter Morales called the ruling a “major step in recognizing full civil rights for LGBTQ people” in [his statement](#).



The UUA is celebrating this historic decision with free marriages to same-sex couples. UU ministers will be offering free weddings in all 50 states and the District of Columbia on July 11 and 12. 2015 General Assembly Wrap-Up

More than 5,000 UUs gathered at the 2015 General Assembly (GA) in Portland, Oregon June 24-28. Thanks to your generous support, this year GA was more accessible than ever. Many events were streamed online and are [now available to watch on uua.org](#), including this year's Ware Lecture by Dr. Cornel West. In his speech Dr. West urged all of us to "Let the phones be smart. We have to be wise and aspire to integrity."



Other highlights of our yearly gathering included an Amplify Love celebration of the U.S. Supreme Court decision in favor of marriage equality after learning more about the Unitarian Universalist Association and our congregational connections in a fun day-long scavenger hunt.



At the end of the week, many UUs joined with local activists to support the Black Lives Matter movement with a die-in outside of the convention center, blocking traffic for nearly five minutes.



Supporting the Black Lives Matter Movement

Our hearts have been broken by the recent wave of violence toward African Americans. With the murders at Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal (AME) Church in Charleston, SC and burning of African American Churches across the South weighing on their minds, General Assembly delegates overwhelmingly passed an Action of Immediate Witness entitled 'Support the Black Lives Matter Movement.' UUs will continue to work for and demand change in our communities.



UUA President Rev. Peter Morales said in [his statement in response to the church burnings](#), "These acts of hatred, oppression, intimidation, and violence, are meant to shake that center of African American life. And we must harness the healing power of love to counter these acts in support and solidarity with these communities." Thanks to your generosity, our UUA will continue to

As the North Carolina federal court begins to hear the NAACP lawsuit challenging the state's voter suppression law, Rev. Peter Morales will join Rev. William Barber in Winston Salem, NC for a Mass Moral Monday March for Voting Rights on July 13. President Morales invites UUs from across the country to join him for the event. Twenty-five years ago on July 26, 1990, the Americans with Disabilities Act was signed into law by President George H. W. Bush. Despite the breadth and magnitude of the bill, the surprising story behind how it came to be is little known.
