### How to Remember Us in Your Will

Making a provision in your will for the Unitarian Universalist Association is a simple process. Such bequests can be included in your will at its creation or added or updated later by means of a codicil, a type of addendum.

There are different ways to make gifts to the Unitarian Universalist Association through your will. The simplest and most popular approach is an outright bequest. Below is suggested wording you can use when writing a charitable bequest to us:

*“I give to the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA) (tax ID number 04-2103733), a nonprofit 501(c)(3) corporation located in Boston, Mass., [\_\_\_\_ percent of my estate or the sum of \$\_\_\_\_] for its general purposes.”*
